



## Breakdown

### Module 1

Getting Started (Month 1) –  
Introduction & Foundations



#### Grammar

- Introduction to parts of speech (nouns, verbs, adjectives, etc.)
- Simple sentence formation
- Basic punctuation



#### Creative Writing

- Icebreakers: “My Favorite Story” or “About Me” short paragraphs
- Free drawing and word association to stimulate ideas

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## Spoken English

- Simple greetings and self-introductions
- Icebreaker games in pairs or small groups



## Activities

- Interactive grammar games
- Story circle for sharing personal experiences
- Fun language quizzes



## Module 2

### Building Basic Skills (Month 2)

#### Grammar

1. Expanding vocabulary
2. Subject-verb agreement
3. Introduction to simple tenses  
(present simple and continuous)



#### Creative Writing

1. Writing simple narratives using a picture prompt
2. Creating sentences that describe everyday activities





## Spoken English

1. Role-play common conversations (e.g., meeting a friend, classroom dialogues)
2. Pair activities to practice pronunciation

## Activities

1. Picture description sessions
2. Sentence scramble puzzles
3. "Find Someone Who..." conversational game





## Module 3

# Expanding Horizons (Month 3)



### Grammar

- Revising basic sentences and tenses
- Introduction to adjectives and adverbs for description



### Creative Writing

- Descriptive writing practice – “Describe Your Favorite Place”
- Guided brainstorming sessions for stories




### Spoken English

- Group discussions on simple topics (e.g., hobbies, favorite foods)
- Practice with short dialogues and daily expressions



### Activities

- “Show and Tell” sessions
- Vocabulary games (word matching, bingo with adjectives)
- Role-play using flashcards



## Module 4

### Structuring Language (Month 4)



#### Grammar

- Introducing articles (a, an, the), prepositions, and conjunctions
- Forming compound sentences

#### Creative Writing

- Writing short paragraphs about daily routines or simple events
- Creating character sketches with the help of prompts



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


## Spoken English

- Pronunciation drills and rhyming games
- Guided conversation practice using sentence starters

## Activities

- “Mad Libs” style fill-in-the-blanks for fun with grammar
- Story-building activities in small groups
- Interactive games focused on sentence construction





## Module 5

### Enhancing Expression (Month 5)

#### Grammar

- Expanding into compound-complex sentences
- Punctuation refinement (commas, question marks, exclamation points)



#### Creative Writing

- Story prompts and flashcards: “Once Upon a Time...”
- Begin writing short stories with a clear beginning, middle, and end



## Spoken English

- Practice short presentations and reciting poems
- Role-playing situational dialogues (e.g., shopping, asking for help)



## Activities

- Story circle feedback sessions
- Peer collaboration on creative projects
- Public speaking games such as "Pass the Story"





## Module 6

### Consolidation of Basics (Month 6)



#### Grammar

- Comprehensive review of learned grammar topics
- Error correction exercises and group grammar challenges

#### Creative Writing

- Writing letters, diary entries, and simple essays
- Editing and refining initial drafts with teacher guidance

#### Spoken English

- Group discussions on familiar topics and storytelling practice
- Listening exercises using age-appropriate audio clips

#### Activities

- Grammar quizzes and interactive online games
- Peer-editing workshops
- “Story in a Bag” activity: random prompts to create impromptu stories



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## Module 7

### Advancing to Intermediate Level (Month 7)

#### Grammar

- Introduction to advanced sentence structures (compound-complex sentences, relative clauses)
- Focus on sentence variation and stylistic punctuation



#### Creative Writing

- Incorporating dialogue in stories
- Creative narrative writing with complex plots

## Spoken English

- Introduction to basic debate techniques and expressing opinions
- Group discussions and guided presentations



## Activities

- Role-playing debates or mock interviews
- Creative writing contests with themed prompts
- "Grammar Relay" – team-based sentence improvement exercises



## Module 8

- Practice with contextual grammar (using grammar in creative writing)

- Writing fairy tales or fables
- Poetic writing: simple poems and rhymes





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## Spoken English

- Story improvisation sessions
- Dramatic readings and role-play of famous scenes

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## Activities

- “Poetry Slam” where students recite and perform their poems
- Group dramatization of short stories
- Creative workshops for editing and enhancing narratives



## Module 9

### Building Confidence (Month 9)

#### Grammar

- Advanced vocabulary building and stylistic writing techniques
- Practice editing for clarity and style



#### Creative Writing

- Crafting original stories with plots, subplots, and character development
- Writing songs or creative scripts for short plays



#### Spoken English

- Practice articulate public speaking and clear enunciation
- Organizing mini-lectures or news reports on simple topics



## Activities

- Open-mic storytelling sessions
- Group projects for collaborative stories
- “Vocabulary Challenge” games





## Module 10

# Integration and Application (Month 10)

### Grammar

- Focus on precision and creative language use



### Creative Writing

- Collaborative group writing projects (e.g., compiling a class storybook)
- Self and peer editing sessions to improve drafts



## **Spoken English**

- Real-life simulations: role-playing scenarios like a restaurant visit or travel guide narration
- Focus on spontaneous conversation through interactive group tasks



## **Activities**

- Peer review workshops and constructive feedback sessions
- Storytelling festivals and creative competitions
- “Real-Life Role Play” games to simulate everyday interactions



## Module 11

### Mastery and Personal Expression (Month 11)

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#### Grammar

1. Consolidate advanced grammar topics through personalized exercises
2. Creative writing warm-up exercises focusing on style and clarity

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#### Creative Writing

1. Develop final creative projects (short story collections, poetry anthology)
2. Focus on originality, voice, and creative expression

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#### Spoken English

1. Enhance fluency with group discussion projects and debates
2. Encourage improvisation and expressive reading from personal work

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## Activities

1. Storytelling competitions with awards
2. Group performances or dramatic enactments based on student-created scripts
3. One-on-one mentoring sessions and individual feedback





## Module 12

#### Creative Writing
